An ancient village of mills on the Mincio
We can not stress it enough, don't miss this magical place.

How to get there:

By car:

A4 Milan-Venice motorway, Peschiera del Garda exit (10 km), turn left and follow the signs to Valeggio.

By train: not recommended!

Borghetto is just a handful of houses, an ancient village of mills in complete symbiosis with its river. A river idyll, with the three ancient mills that seem to rise out of the water.

Strolling through Borghetto in the evening to see a sunset over the Mincio, is like sinking into an imaginary medieval world.

We recommend:

It's really very small and in a 20 minute walk you'll have seen it all, but if you need some time off from sight seeing and you just want to relax, unwind, and do nothing, we can't think of a better place to do it in.

Borghetto, is as expensive as it is beautiful, but There's the café right on the water, try to get a place on the balcony and have a nice glass of wine.

The famous tortellini of Valeggio, delicious in broth and heavenly with melted butter; these are made strictly by hand and can be purchased at many pasta shops in Valeggio and Borghetto.

Here tortellini are called “nodo d’amore” (love knot) because they look like the knot of a silk handkerchief tied by two lovers before they threw themselves into the Mincio.

Sigurta Park

125 acres of luxurious greenery, it’s considered one of the most beautiful gardens in the world. It’s not cheap (adults 8.50 €, children 2.50€, 0 -4 for free), but if your planning the perfect picnic it’s truly a spectacular place.

There is a train ride and bikes for hire (also for kids).
